### PLANE CRASHES AT CITY OF TAYLOR MUNICIPAL AIRPORT *No Injuries Reported to Pilot of Single-Engine RV-4*

**TAYLOR, Texas** –The City of Taylor Police Department responded to a report of a crash of a single-engine airplane at the City of Taylor Municipal Airport on Thursday, March 21 at 12:38 p.m. The pilot was not injured. The FAA and Texas DPS have been notified. DPS units are on the scene.

Pilot Jack Crabtree, 85, of Austin, was attempting to land his single-engine RV-4 airplane at the northwest runway of the Taylor Municipal Airport when his airplane ended up nose-down. Mr. Crabtree, who was traveling by himself without any passengers, was not injured, and refused EMS treatment at the site. Personnel from the City of Taylor Police and Fire Departments were on the scene immediately upon notification of the incident.

Airport Manager David Cornelius was notified of the accident as soon as it occurred. He said it was fortunate that the crash was a minor one. “While there was some damage to the airplane, we are all grateful that the pilot was not injured in the accident.”
